We have a solar panel installed and rainwater harvesting pits for optimum utilization of natural resources. Every year a part of the budget is utilized for the purpose.

The institution has a stated energy policy streamlining ways of energy conservation and, the use of alternate sources of energy for meeting its power requirements. All the classrooms are ventilated and airy with proper sunlight. In the building AC is not used, students are educated in natural sunlight and are instructed to switch off extra lights and fans. A poster to save electricity is used.

The college building has well-lit classrooms, staff rooms, and offices to minimize the consumption of artificial light. The old fans have been replaced to reduce the consumption of energy. The students and staff members are instructed to switch off the electric switches if they are not in use. x We are gradually shifting towards LED lights. Aluminum wiring has been replaced by copper wiring to minimize the wastage of electricity. LT Panels with MCCB & Capacitors have been installed to optimize energy consumption. Tinted films have been placed on windows facing the sun in some of the rooms.

The Institutional values are Integrity, Student Centric, Ethics & Dignity, Transparency Professionalism, and Diversity, and are displayed on the website and at various places in the Institution. Keeping the value system of the institute at the center the peripheral processes are designed and special attention is given to proper facilities for differently abled people.
